## DRAFT PLANT BREEDERS' RIGHTS BILL

## **INVITATION FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS**

I, Tina Joemat-Pettersson, Minister of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries hereby invite all interested institutions, organizations and individuals to submit written comments on the draft Plant Breeders' Rights Bill.

Some of the key amendments include:

- Extending protection to all plant genera and species.
- Extending period of protection to 30 years for identified crops.
- Providing for realistic periods for submission of plant material for test and trials.
- Providing for automatic provisional protection without the undertaking not to sell, in South Africa, any reproductive material of the variety in question while the provisional protection is in force.
- Providing for inspection of documents maintained by the Registrar and stipulating what would be regarded as confidential information.
- Providing for provisions to deal with objections and appeals adequately.
- Increased penalties for offences in terms of this Act.
- Amendment of the Farmers' Privilege clause.
- Provision for varieties of recent creation.
- Empowering the Minister to establish a Plant Breeders' Rights Advisory Committee to advise the Registrar on matters related to plant variety protection.
- Amending the structure of the legislation by consolidating related sections into relevant chapters.
