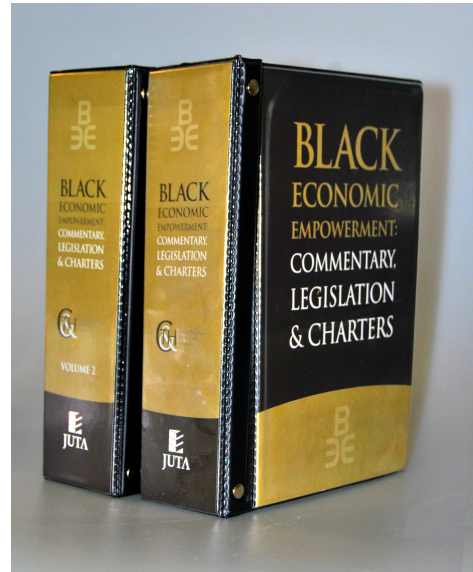


Black Economic Empowerment: Commentary, Legislation and Charters
