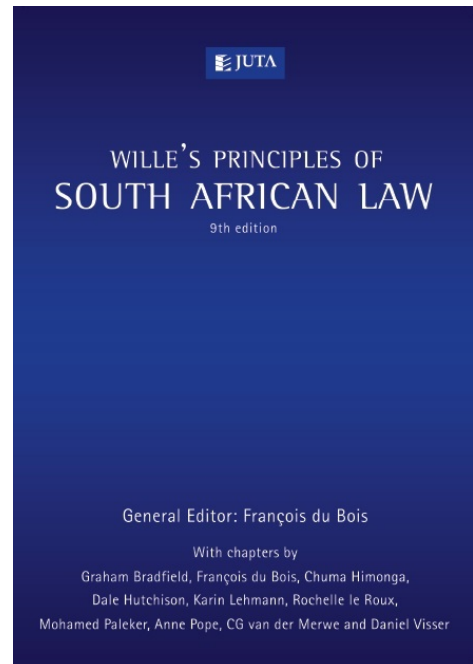


Wille's Principles of South African Law
