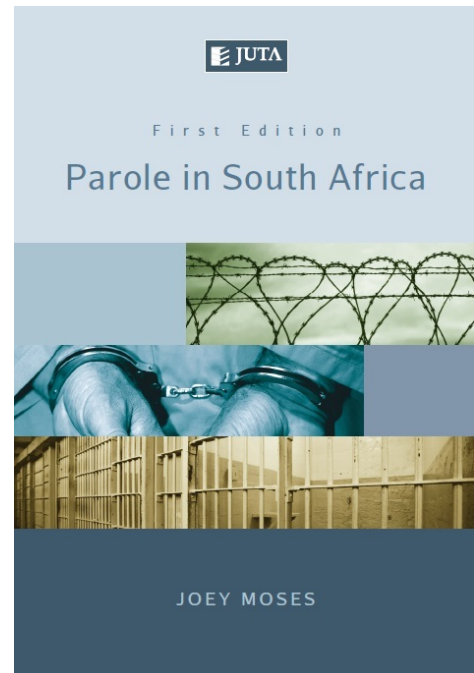


Parole in South Africa
