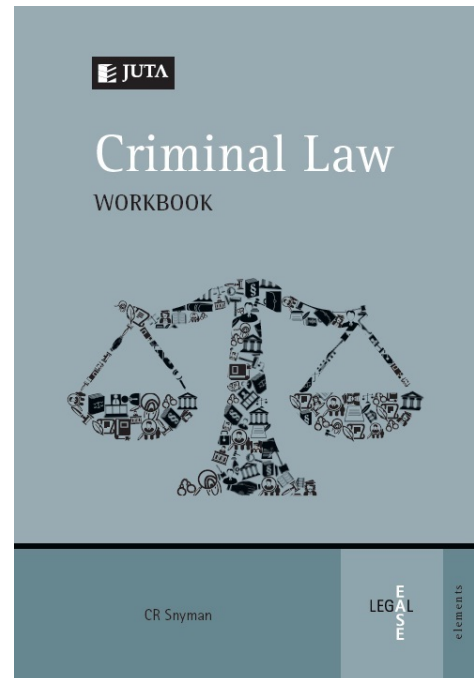


Criminal Law Workbook
