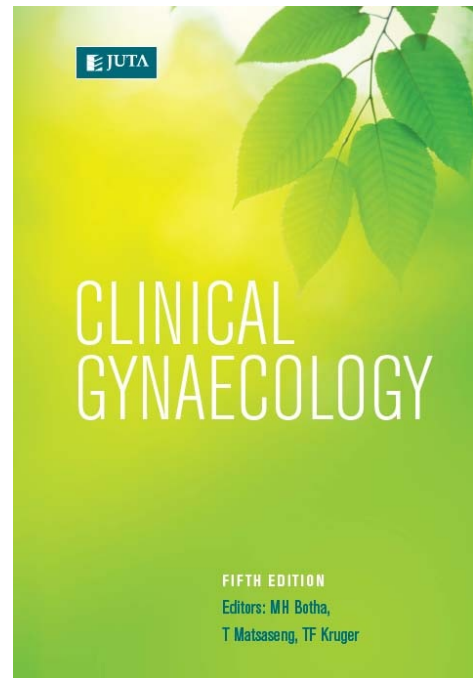


Clinical Gynaecology
