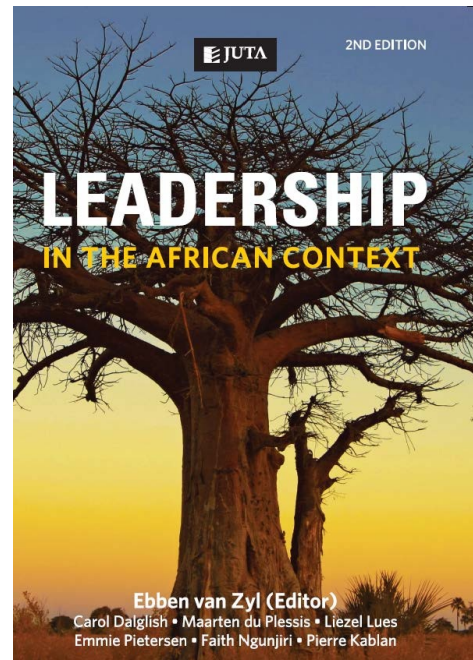


Leadership: in the African Context
