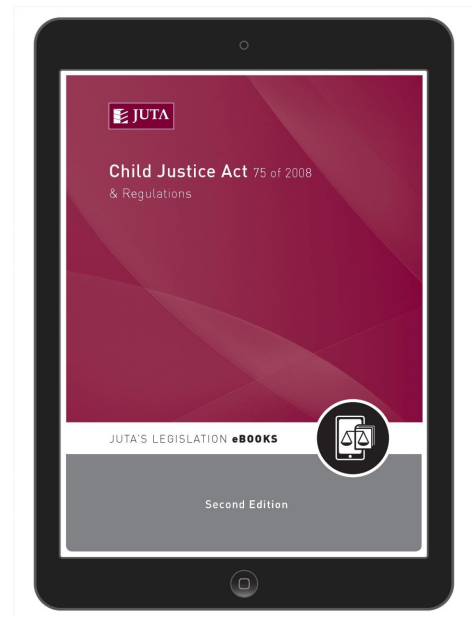


Child Justice Act 75 of 2008 & Regulations
