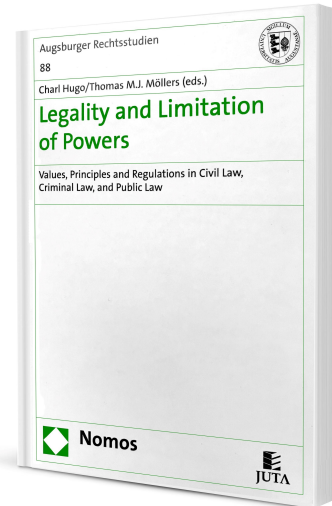


Legality and Limitation of Powers
