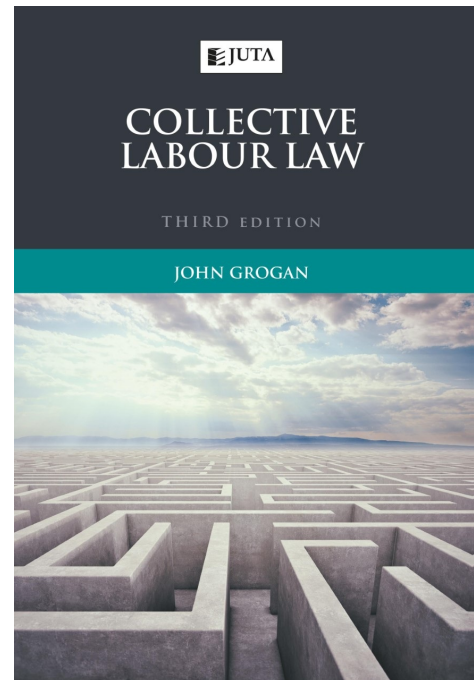


Collective Labour Law
