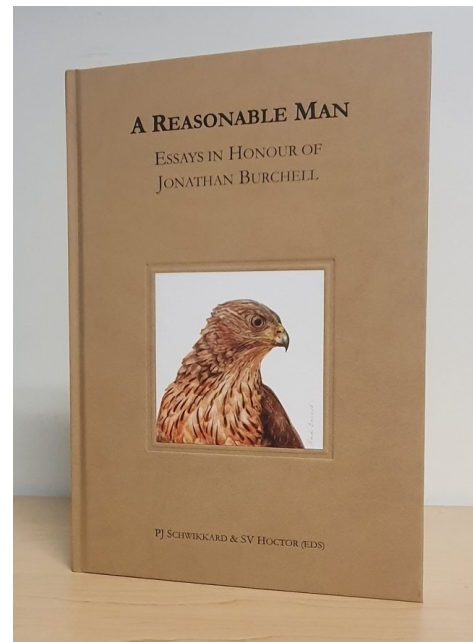


Reasonable Man, A: Essays in honour of Jonathan Burchell
